#### **Prof. Matthias FINGER**

Matthias Finger has been a Professor of Management of Network Industries at EPFL since 2002. In 2010, he was the Director of the Transport Area of the Florence School of Regulation at the European University Institute.

He holds a PhD in political science from the University of Geneva. Prior to joining EPFL, he was an Assistant Professor at Syracuse University (New York), an Associate Professor at Columbia University (New York), and a Professor of Management of Public Enterprises at the Swiss Federal Institute of Public Administration.

Matthias is also a member of the Swiss Railways and the Swiss Electricity Regulatory Authorities. His main research interest is on the liberalization, re-regulation, and governance of infrastructures in the transport, energy, and communications sectors. He is the co-editor in chief of the Journal *Competition and Regulation in Network Industries*.

#### **Prof. Nikolas GEROLIMINIS**

Nikolas Geroliminis is the Director of the Urban Transport Systems Laboratory and an Assistant Professor at the School of Architecture, Civil and Engineering, in the Ecole Polytechnique Fédérale de Lausanne (EPFL).

He has a diploma in Civil Engineering from the National Technical University of Athens (NTUA) and a MSc and Ph.D. in Civil Engineering from University of California, Berkeley. Before joining EPFL he was an Assistant Professor on the faculty of the Department of Civil Engineering at the University of Minnesota, where he still has an Adjunct Professor's appointment.

He is a member of the Transportation Research Board's Traffic Flow Theory Committee. His research interests focus primarily on urban transportation systems, traffic flow theory and control, public transportation and logistics. He serves in the editorial board of Transportation Research, part B and Transportation Letters Journals. He received the University of California "Transportation Student of the Year" award in 2007 and the "Outstanding Graduate Student Instructor Award" in 2006.
